#### **Payments**

We thank parents for your understanding and patience with the ongoing payment issues experienced this term. All systems are back up and running again.

A few reminders regarding payments

- EFTPOS is available but only for amounts \$10 or over.
- Please avoid using large notes when paying for excursions. We do not keep money on premises and we cannot change \$50 notes.
- A reminder that payments can be made online via the "Make a Payment" tab on our website. Online

payments close **one** day before the payment due date.

#### **Bus-fare Evasion**

A message regarding bus travel to and from school:

Students must present a working Opal card to "Tap on" and "Tap off" every time at their respective locations or if they do not qualify for a Student Opal card, they must pay a fare.

If their Student Opal card does not work they must pay a fare until their new Opal card arrives, unless they can produce an official letter from Opal stating that their new card is being processed.

The fares for Students are: \$1.30 each way, cash or they can pay with a Child/Youth Opal card which are available at Rover's office or any participating Opal outlet (Unregistered). They can register them at some time in the future if they wish through Opal 13 67 25.

#### Change of details

If you have moved, changed phone numbers, etc over the holidays, please ask at the office for an information update (pink) form. That way, we are able to contact you, when needed.

#### **Early Leavers**

If parents are collecting children early from school, a reminder that we require photo identification to do so.

If a person, other than the parent or emergency contacts, arrive at school, we cannot allow a child to be taken without prior parental consent.

These matters are for the protection of our students and are not meant to inconvenience parents.

We also ask that students not be collected, as much as possible during recess (11am - 11.25am) or lunch (1.20pm -2pm).
